We shared our first research results.

"We started testing resistance in 2015 [...] Our role, with Deleplanque, is to understand the genetic resistance of beets to viruses and to select new resistant hybrids" Axel Schechert, Head of Research & Development Sugarbeet

Now we can announce:

"Today, the genetic resources we have are capable of securing 85% of their potential yield when beet yellows pressure is very high" *
